Oh, What a Beautiful Morning...Gain Superpowers

Read [Matthew 5:8](#)



11 | Mon – Heart quality | Read [Matthew 5:8 / Psalm 51:10-13](#)

The word *pure* used in Matthew 5 denotes a heart that is clean, clear, and unpolluted by sin. (The opposite of a pure heart is a devious one.) People with this quality are not motivated by selfish concerns and consequently can see things more clearly. Only God knows everything about everything, but heart purity can produce the superpower of spiritual discernment—the ability to see directly into the heart of a matter. Do you have this special eyesight?

12 | Tue – Seeing... but not really | Read [Luke 24:13-21 and 28-32](#)

Have you found yourself looking everywhere for something and discovered it right in front of you? Two Jesus followers were walking back to their village after his death, crushed and confused, when a traveler on the road joined their conversation. Over dinner, they continued talking till suddenly their eyes were opened and they saw it was Jesus! Why do you think they did not recognize him right away? Have you ever walked away from something and realized later how God was in it?

13 | Wed – Spiritual cataracts | Read [Matthew 15:12-13](#)

Jesus was very direct when speaking to the Pharisees. These elite religious leaders studied the law and interpreted it to the common people. When Jesus called them out in Matthew 23, he repeatedly declared they were blind. Pride in their spiritual knowledge caused them to miss the heart of God behind the laws to be obeyed. They had become the blind leading the blind (Matt. 15:12-13). How is it possible to believe in God, yet totally miss His heart?

14 | Thu – Two kinds of blindness | Read [Acts 9:9-19](#)

Saul was a highly respected Pharisee, passionate to preserve God's law. In his zeal to protect God's honor, he was spiritually blinded to the truth of Jesus' identity. As a result of a roadside encounter with the risen Jesus, Saul became physically blind. Notice what happened in v. 18 after Saul sat in complete darkness for three days. Has God helped you see a truth that you had previously been blind to? What happened?

15 | Fri – A new way of 'seeing' | Read [2 Kings 6:15-17](#)

Do you sometimes find yourself thinking God doesn't seem to be making much progress in transforming the world? Things are not always as they seem. God's work is often quiet, gradual and behind the scenes. It is important to recognize that no human being, including yourself, completely understands what is happening inside another person's heart. This week try looking more closely at people and situations. God is doing more than you know and often differently than you would expect. Record your insights and share it with someone else.

16 | Sat – Are you up to the challenge? | Read [2 Corinthians 4:18](#)

Too often people see a need or injustice, make a plan and then ask God to bless it. A wise person once suggested that it is better to look for where God is already working and then join Him there. What might happen if you took the challenge to be a God-chaser, a person who watches for signs of God at work everywhere they go. When you start being intentional, you will be amazed at what you find.
